[HealthMeasures](http://www.healthmeasures.net) is a research resource that supports, administers, and provides an integrated platform to assess health outcomes via self-report measures of physical, mental, and social health or performance measures of cognitive, motor, or sensory function. HealthMeasures provides automated use of four state-of-the-science measurement systems that were originally developed as separate NIH programs: PROMIS®, Neuro-QoL, ASCQ-Me, and the NIH Toolbox® for the Assessment of Neurological and Behavioral Function®.
